

- Q What became of you after he left? A I was old enough to take care of myself, but after Low Chut went to China, Lee Loy took care of me.
- Q Where is Lee Loy? A He also went to China and died there.
- Q When did he go there? A K.S.20 or 21 (1894- 1895).
- Q Did you ever have any brothers or sisters? A No.
- Q When did your parents die? A My father died C.R.4/9-8 (1915, Oct.16). My mother died K.S.31/10-1 (1905, Oct.28).
- Q How many times have you been married? A Once, only, K. S.18/12 (1893, Jan.), (or Feb.), in China, to Fong Shee, who died C.R.10 (1921), in China. She was never in the United States.
- Q Did you ever have any other children than your two sons who have been admitted to this country? A I have one elder daughter, who is married, in China; no others.
- Q What is your daughters' name, and when, where and whom did she marry?
- A Lee Huet Ying, married in C.R. 9 (1920), to Leung Duk, in Dai Hing village, Gow Gong Section, Nam Hoy District, China.
- Q Do you know whether your birth was recorded? A I don't know.
- Q When did you first make the acquaintance of Jeong Woon?
- A I have known him ever since I was a child.
- Q Has he lived in San Francisco, continuously, since you first knew him?
- A Yes, with the exception of the period during the earthquake, in 1906 when he went away for a number of years.
- Q When did you first make the acquaintance of Chew Chung Tak.
- A I have also known him ever since I was a child.
- Q Has he lived in San Francisco, continuously, since you first knew him?
- A Yes, excepting during the earthquake and fire of 1906, when he went away for a short period of time.
- Q Did you leave San Francisco at the time of the earthquake in 1906?
- A Yes; I went over to Oakland, for a short time.
- Q How long? A For about a year.
- Q Is that where these two witnesses went at the time of the earthquake?
- A No.
- Q How do you know it isn't? A After the earthquake they went to the country, and they told me that after they came back from the country.
- Q What was Jeong Woon's occupation when you first knew him?
- A He was working in my father's store at 929 Grant Avenue.
- Q What was Chew Chung Tak doing when you first knew him?
- A He was in the grocery business in the Gwong Wing Chung Company, and delivered provisions to our store, the Dai Sang Tong Co.
- Q What kind of a store did your father conduct? A My father was in the herb business and was also an herb doctor.
- Q What became of his store, when he went to China? A The store was taken over by Low Chut.
- Q How long did it continue in business at that same address?
- A When I was in china, in K.S.26 (1900), the Dai Sang Tong Co. moved to 718 Jackson Street.
- Q Was your father's store on the ground floor? A 929 Grant Ave. was entirely occupied by Dai Sang Tong Co. Only the main floor of the premises at 718 Jackson St. was occupied by the Dai Sang Tong Company, when it moved there.
- Q How many stories high was 929 Grant Ave., when your father's store was there? A Three stories.
- Q How many floors did your father's store occupy? A The second floor were used as storerooms, the partners of the store slept on the second floor, and my mother slept on the third floor, where I was born.
