

- Q Are your witnesses married?
 A Jeong Woon is married, but not Chew Chung Tak.
 Q Did you ever know Jeong Woon's wife? A No.
 Q Did she never live in this country? A Yes.
 Q Has Jeong Woon any children? A I heard that he had children, but I do not know the number of children he has.
 Q Were any of his children born in the United States? A Yes, from what I know.
 Q What do you know about that? A I have only heard that he has children born in this country. I have never seen them.
 Q Were you ever arrested? A No.
 Q Did you register under the Selective Service Act? A No; I was over age.
 Q According to the date you give as your birth, you were not beyond the age of those required to register under that Act, in 1918.
 A I was nearly forty-five(45) and knew that I would not be selected if I was registered, so I did not register.
 Q Nevertheless, it was your duty, as an American citizen, to so register.
 A I never expected to be called, even if I did register.
 Q Have you ever cast a vote or registered as a voter? A No.
 Q Have you at any time, for any reason, whatever, other than when testifying before this Service, or when applying for your Certificate of Residence, claimed to have been born in the United States?
 A None that I can think of, except, probably, at the bank; I went to the Pacific States Savings and Loan Assn., a long time ago, and opened an account, under the name, Lee Hee(Hay), and I think I was required to give my place of birth, on one of their cards, and if I was so required, I gave San Francisco as my birth place.
 Q Do you drive an automobile? A No.
 Q Have you ever made an application or for any other document, at which time you might be required to give your place of birth?
 A No.
 Q Have you ever been an inmate of the County or any other hospital? A No.
 Q Did you ever attend school?
 A Yes; I attended the Presbyterian, Chinese, Mission School, San Francisco, when I was 12 or 13 years old; and I attended school, upstairs, over the Him Sing Chung Co., their present location, 1061 Grant Ave., where an American Mission teacher taught.
 Q Have you any further statement to make? A No.
 Q (In English) Have you understood this interpreter? A Yes.
